Changing Your Name as an Adult

Note: Use these instructions and forms to change your name.

These instructions and forms may not be right for your case. They can not take the place of advice from a lawyer. Talk to a lawyer if you have **any** questions.

Do not change these forms. If you change the forms, you might lose language you need.

What Forms Will I Need to Change My Name?

If you are over 18, you will need to fill out and file the following forms to change your name with the District Court in the jurisdiction where you reside.

- Petition for Name Change
- Order Setting Hearing
- Notice of Hearing on Name Change
- Order for Name Change
- Affidavit of Inability to Pay (only if you cannot afford filing fees)

The **Petition** asks the court to change your name and schedule a hearing.

The **Order Setting Hearing** will be filled out by the judge and will tell you when and where your hearing will be held. It will also tell you how you should notify the public about your hearing.

The **Notice of Hearing on Name Change** will be filled out by the judge or the clerk of district court. You will need to publish the notice in the newspaper or post it in three public places to notify the public about your hearing.

The **Order for Name Change** will be filled out by the judge. The Order will grant your name change and will order changes to your birth records.

The **Affidavit of Inability to Pay** asks the court to waive filing fees in your case. If you can not afford to pay the filing fees, ask your clerk of district court for an affidavit of inability to pay. This form may be called something else in your district.

What Words Do I Need to Know?




Petitioner- A Petitioner is someone who files an action in court. If you are asking the Court to change your name, you are the Petitioner.

Notice of Hearing- As the Petitioner, you will be required to give the public notice of the hearing on your name change. You must publish notice of the hearing in the local newspaper or, if there is no newspaper in your county, you must post the notice in at least three public places. You must bring a receipt or some other proof that you gave notice to the court before a hearing can be held on your name change.

Who Can Use the Form?

You can use these forms if you:

- Want to change your name;
- Are over 18 years old;
- Are not changing your name in order to avoid debt, hide a criminal record, or for any other improper reason.



Note: If you use these forms, notice of your name change hearing must be given in a newspaper or in public places. If you are changing your name because you are in danger, you should not use these forms.

If letting the public know that you are changing your name would put you in danger, use the <u>Changing Your</u> <u>Name under Sealed-Record Forms</u>.

Talk to a lawyer if you have any questions.

If you want to change the name of a child, use the <u>Changing the Name of a</u> <u>Child Forms</u>.

What Do I Do with the Forms?

1 Fill out the Forms

Fill out all the blanks on the Petition for Name Change.

Sign and date your Petition for Name Change.

Fill out the judicial district, county, and caption on all of the other

forms (Order Setting Hearing, Notice of Hearing on Name Change,

and the Order for Name Change). The caption looks like this:

2 Make Copies

Make one copy of each form after you have filled them out.

3 File Forms at the Courthouse

- Go to the Clerk of District Court's office in your county courthouse.
 File the original Petition for Name Change, Order Setting Hearing, and Notice of Hearing on Name Change.
- If you can't afford the filing fees, ask the Clerk of District Court for an Affidavit of Inability to Pay. This form may be called something different in your county.
- Give the Clerk of Court a self-addressed stamped envelope. Be sure to ask the Clerk of Court to mail two conformed copies of the Order Setting Hearing to you after the judge signs it. If you do not have an Order of Inability to Pay from the judge, you may be charged a fee for these copies.
- Give your copies to the Clerk of District Court and ask her to stamp them as "Filed". Keep the copies in a safe place.

4 Publish Notice of the Hearing

When the judge sets a hearing date, you will get an Order Setting Hearing and Notice of Hearing. The Order Setting hearing will tell you where you need to publish the Notice of Hearing.

Note: You must publish notice of your hearing for 4 weeks **before** your hearing.



Get a receipt or other proof that your notice was published. Put it with your other forms. You will need the proof for your hearing.

5 Fill out Your Order for Name Change

- Fill in all of the blanks that you can on the Order for Name Change.
 If the judge gives you your name change, s/he will sign the Order after your hearing
- Make one copy of your filled in Order for Name Change.

6 Go to Your Hearing

- Bring your stamped copies of the documents you filed with the court. Also bring your original and copy of your Order for Name Change.
- Arrive at the courthouse at least 15 minutes before your scheduled hearing. Dress like you were going to an important job interview.
 - Check with the Clerk of Court's office to find the right courtroom for your hearing. Go to that courtroom and wait for the judge to call your name and case number. Remember to address the judge as "Your Honor".

Be prepared to tell the judge why you want to change your name.

Important: Immediately after your hearing, take your signed Order for Name Change to the Clerk of District Court. You may want to ask the Clerk for several certified copies of the order. You will need the certified copies to get a new driver's license, birth certificate, and social security card.



Where Can I Get More Information?

The Montana Code Annotated (M.C.A.) contains the law on changing your name. The laws related to changing your name can be found in Title 27, Chapter 31. The M.C.A. can be found at your local library or on the Montana State Law Library website at <u>www.lawlibrary.mt.gov</u>. Click on the "State Laws" option near the top of the page and select "MCA" from the list.



These organizations may be able to help you:

- Montana Legal Services Association (MLSA) gives free legal help to low and moderate-income people. To find out if you qualify for MLSA, call the MLSA HelpLine at 1-800-666-6899.
- The State Bar Lawyer Referral and Information Service (LRIS) refers people to Montana lawyers who might be able to help. The referral is free. Call LRIS at 1-406-449-6577.
